People wanting to participate in the practical propagating box session are asked to bring along a Styrofoam box and a piece of 3 mm cut glass 240 X 470 mm. Styrofoam boxes can usually be obtained for free from green grocers and supermarkets. People can order a sheet of cut glass when booking at a cost of \$10. Styrofoam boxes are also available for \$2.

Soil, seedling mix and manures will be provided. There will also be some seeds to plant but people are encouraged to bring along their own seeds, both to plant and to swap with others.

Ideal seeds to plant in a propagating box at this time of year include: Lettuce, tomato, basil, capsicum, celery, eggplant, chilli, leek and Silverbeet.
